Pancake Breakfast.

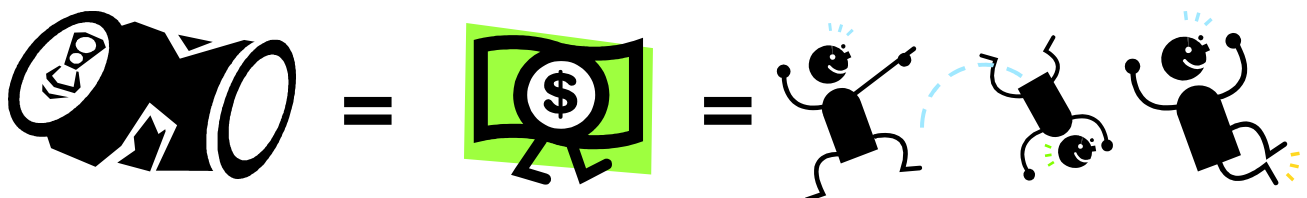
Buses for Camps.

The Monthly Can Drive is held on the 2nd Saturday of every month, all year round. Family Members of SACS volunteer to drive the routes through out the city of Shakopee and the surrounding area to pick up aluminum cans. In order to participate in the Can Drive all someone needs to do is...

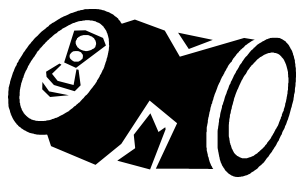
1. Place the aluminum cans at the end of their driveway by 9:30am on the 2nd Saturday of the month. A volunteer will pick them up.

OR

2. Aluminum cans can be dropped off **ANYTIME** at the "Brown Recycling Shed" at the CEC/SACS or at the "Red" Shed behind the rectory at Marystown Church.

The more families that participate in Aluminum Can Recycling, the more money PIP has to support programs that directly benefit the students of SACS.

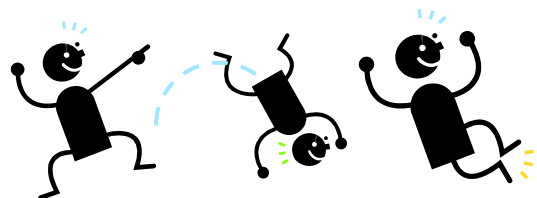

“Monthly Can Drive” - Frequently Asked Questions

If I live outside the Shakopee school district, will aluminum cans be picked up from my house? No, unfortunately only the houses that are within the school district boundary are included on the routes. The option at this time would be to use one of the 2 drop off locations.

Can my neighbors participate in the Monthly Can Drive by placing their cans at the end of their drive way? Yes. In fact, many residents of Shakopee, who are not members of the Catholic Churches, have been faithful participants for many years. “The more the merrier!”

Can I recycle other metal or plastic items with SACS? Only aluminum cans are accepted for the CAN DRIVE.

If my aluminum cans are not picked up, and my home is located within the Shakopee School district, who should I call? **SACS** school office, general phone number **952-445-3387**. The information will be directed to the CAN DRIVE Chairperson - Brad Nelson.

Do I need to call and let the Route Drivers know I have cans to be picked up? No, just place the aluminum cans at the end of your driveway before 9:30am on the pick up date and a volunteer will come and pick them up.

How do I volunteer to drive a route and pick up cans? First you need a pick up or a trailer. You will receive LOVE hours. Either sign up on the LOVE agreement or call the CAN DRIVE chairman, Brad Nelson.

My workplace generates many aluminum cans, how can I recycle them for SACS? Bring them to one of the two drop off sites anytime.

What impact will my “minimal” 12 pack a week have? If every family recycled 12 cans per week, at 2 1/2 cents per can, at today's aluminum prices it would generate approximately 7500\$ per year.

Where is the biggest opportunity to increase CAN DRIVE participation? Right here at SACS. The majority of the current participants are parish and community members, outside of SACS, who have been participating for many years. Through research we have determined that increasing the participation of **SACS families** would significantly increase the profit from the CAN DRIVE.
